Jumpstart and Review:

Paul's letter to the Ephesian church is NOT for the average church goer! Like the Song of Solomon was restricted to men of a certain age & maturity level, Ephesians was/is for Christ-like believers who had graduated petty, carnal skirmishes. The Book of Ephesians ignores the distractive tendencies that make up most pointless Kingdom arguments and deals directly with the "root" cause.

Bitterness: anger that was ignored or swept under the "rug"; vintage anger

Here's What We Know:

- 1. BITTERNESS CAUSES A NEGATIVE CHANGE IN ALTITUDE
- 2. BITTERNESS CAUSES A NEGATIVE CHANGE IN APPETITE
- 3. BITTERNESS CAUSES A NEGATIVE CHANGE IN ACCURACY

What Changes This Narrative: FORGIVENESS

'And **forgive us our** debts, as we have **forgive**n **our** debtors [letting go of both the wrong and the resentment]. Matthew 6:12 [AMP]

'And **forgive us our** sins, For we **our**selves also **forgive** everyone who is indebted to **us** [who has offended or wronged **us**]. And lead **us** not into temptation [but rescue **us** from evil]."' Luke 11:4 [AMP]
